Public Benefit Description

As a physician-led specialty medical group, we earn our patients' trust by delivering the best practices and latest advances in medicine as we improve the lives and health of our community. The Oregon Clinic was founded by physicians twenty-four years ago to provide the highest quality specialty health care to Oregonians. Each year since our founding, we have grown to include more physicians and more patients, always with a steadfast commitment to providing the best possible care and putting our patients first.

Throughout our history, we have also made the commitment to serve low-income patients who have Medicaid, Medicare or no insurance at all. Many of the approximately 550,000 patient visits we provide each year are to low-income patients, resulting in more than \$56,800,000 in community benefit care as defined by the State of Oregon Community Benefit reporting regulations.

In addition to providing high-quality care to all patients, including low-income patients, The Oregon Clinic provides community benefit through:

- Prioritizing an excellent workplace by providing exceptional benefits and respect for our staff. We are extremely proud to have been awarded top ten among large companies in Oregon in the Top Workplace awards four years in a row, including First Place Top Large Workplace in 2017.
- Providing leadership in the medical community as program directors, chairs or members of committees and boards.
- Providing thousands of hours of critical hospital call.
- Training the next generation of specialists through fellowship programs and residencies
- Sponsoring and financially supporting medical foundations, sports teams, and non-profits.

Extenuating Circumstance

The Oregon Clinic has been successful in its pursuit of providing public benefit in 2017 and will continue to build on this success.

Process for Selecting Third Party Assessment

After extensive research of appropriate third-party assessment tools, The Oregon Clinic chose the B-lab assessment because it is considered a gold standard in benefit reporting. It also allows for some flexibility to meet the specifics of the healthcare field. Many of the alternative third-party tools were focused on other



industries or did not seem appropriately robust. The B-labs tool is also specifically designed to meet the needs of state benefit company reporting.

Connection Between Org and Standards Body

The Oregon Clinic's staff, directors, shareholders or directors do not have any known connection to B-lab.

Third Party Standard Used

In this benefit report, the assessment of the overall social and environmental performance of the benefit corporation against a third-party standard was applied consistently with our prior reports.

Score

The Oregon Clinic received a score of 83.3 out of 200 possible points on our annual assessment. The threshold for passing is 80 points.
